



- There are approx. 754,000 incorporated businesses in Georgia (SOS: 6/10)
- 97.5% categorized as small by the Federal Gov't. (< 500 employees) compared to 99.7% nationally
- 95% employ fewer than 50
- 87% of all of GA businesses employ 5 and under (AEO / US Census)

- GA ranks #1 in US for Entrepreneurship – up from #3 (Kauffman 5/09)

- Atlanta named Best City for new grads due to affordable rent & opportunities for popular entry-level categories: sales, marketing, customer service (Apartments.com and CBcampus.com 5/10)
- The top-performing 1% of firms in any given year generate roughly 40% of all new jobs; gazelle firms (ages 3-5 yrs.) comprise less than 1% of all companies yet generate roughly 10% of all new jobs (Kauffman 3/10)
- From '05-07: Stage 1 (1-9 empl.) establishments created 73.2% of job growth and Stage 2 (10-99 empl.) created 25.8% of job growth (Lowe Foundation '09)
- Second stage companies represent 10% of established businesses and 37% of jobs (EG 09)
- Between '07 and '08, GA added the 4th most people and was the 9th fastest growing state in terms of its year-over-year growth rate." (US Census)
- Half of the businesses started in '08 were by minorities (FRBA '08)
- Small businesses comprise over 50% of the workforce (SOS 2/09)
- Small businesses in inner cities added nearly 3x the number of new jobs than larger companies in '95-'02 (SBA 3/08)
